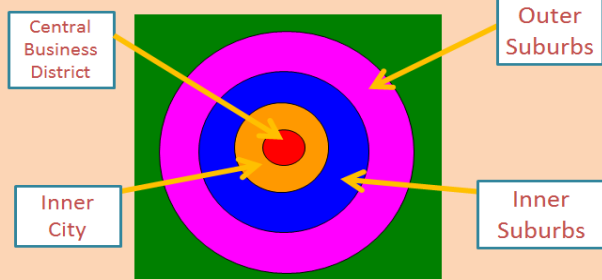
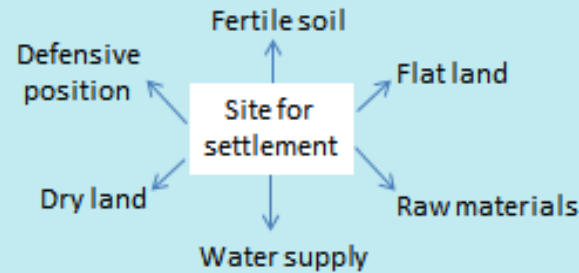




Year 7 Geography: Settlement
