### Tier 3 Language & Definitions

<b>Story Theatre</b>	Actors use multi-rolling and narration to tell one or more stories.
<b>Exaggerated Non-Naturalistic Style</b>	Performers frequently use pantomime to dramatise the story.
<b>Costumes</b>	Helps identify characters.
<b>Sound Effects</b>	Noises sometimes created by the actors on the stage.
<b>Props/set</b>	Items used on stage to add to the story - can be used in multiple ways.
<b>Slow Motion</b>	To slow down time on stage in order to mark a significant moment or event.
<b>Sound Scape</b>	A collection of sounds created by either the actors themselves or by some form of percussion.
<b>Characters</b>	The way an actor plays a role using his/her acting skills. You can show a character in the way you walk and move (body language), in the way you speak (vocal qualities) and in your reaction to events in the drama.
<b>Dialogue</b>	Lines and narration.
<b>Synchronised Movement</b>	When two or more performers do the same actions at the same time as each other.
<b>Canon</b>	When two or more performers do the same actions but one after the other, i.e. a Mexican Wave.
<b>Chorus</b>	In Classical Greek drama - a group of actors who described and commented upon the main action in unison.
<b>Unison</b>	Where everyone does the same thing at the same time.

### Tier 2 Language

<b>Create</b>	To build, assemble, or produce something. The act of creating is usually tied to being innovative with existing materials.
<b>Research</b>	A detailed study of a subject, especially in order to discover (new) information or reach a (new) understanding.
<b>Evaluate</b>	To determine how and why you have chosen to do something and access the impact of your work.
