

Harmony and Tonality

The **chords** used in the music

Chord	Major	Minor
		
Two or more notes played together		

Dynamics

The **volume** of a sound or piece of music.



<	Crescendo Becoming gradually louder
ff	Fortissimo Very loud
f	Forte Loud
mf	Mezzoforte Moderately loud
mp	Mezopiano Moderately soft
p	Piano Soft
pp	Pianissimo Very soft
>	Diminuendo Becoming gradually softer






Rhythm (and Metre)

The **pattern** of the notes against the **beat**.

Beat	Note value	Time Signature
		
Steady pulse of the music	How long a note lasts	How many beats in a bar






Melody

The **tune** that you hear

Ascending	Descending	Range	Conjunct	Disjunct
				
Going up in pitch.	Going down in pitch.	The difference between the highest and lowest note - wide or narrow	Moves up or down by step.	Moves in big leaps.

Texture

The **layers** of sound and how they fit together

Unison	Imitation	Monophonic	Polyphonic	Melody and Accompaniment
				
All doing the same thing at the same time	When one part copies another	A single voice or instrument	Different parts that interweave together	A main melody with all other parts in the background

Tempo

The **speed** of the music




Slow (Turtle), Fast (Rabbit)

Structure

The **order of sections** in a piece of music

Intro	Attract listener's attention and introduce them to the song.
Verse	Tell the story, give the details.
Pre-Chorus	Build anticipation for the chorus.
Chorus	Main theme or message. Repeated more than once.
Bridge	Create a break away from or variation to rest of song.
Outro	Conclusion. End the song with variation or fade out.
