The values are underpinned by four Houses, each of which is connected by role-models who have lived out these values: William and Catherine Booth, Martin Luther-King Junior, Jackie Pullinger and Archbishop Oscar Romero. Every student, from Year 7 to Year 11, is a member of one of these Houses, which work together to serve those in need, raise charitable funds and compete with each other for the House Cup every year.

Curriculum

The curriculum at Emmanuel has been designed to ensure that students receive a broad and balanced educational diet, including Arts, Languages, Computer Science, Design Technology, Geography, History and PE, alongside the core subjects of Maths, English and Science.

Students embark on a 5-year journey of learning from the end of primary school up to the end of Level 3 and Level 2 options. A their GCSE examinations. Years 7-9 are all about enjoying the breadth of the curriculum, through classroom and extracurricular learning. At the end of Year 9 students have the opportunity to make informed decisions about which additional three qualifications that they would like

to study until the end of Year 11. These options cover traditional GCSEs, as well as vocational qualifications in construction, art, hospitality and catering, music technology, sport and media. In addition, all students pursue Religious Studies to GCSE.

Most of our students progress into our Sixth Form, which offers over 25 courses, including traditional A Level courses and vocational carefully planned programme of Relationships Sex and Health Education (RSHE) runs throughout the 7 years at Emmanuel, ensuring that students leave us well informed about safety, personal finance, healthy relationships and British Values.

Teaching and Learning

At Emmanuel, we have developed our Teaching and Learning Framework over a number of years. This framework ensures that students develop knowledge, deepen understanding and experience regular opportunities, both inside and outside of the classroom to transfer knowledge more confidently in exams and real life. We have a shared language to talk about learning, based on trusted cognitive science. Furthermore, we believe in the importance of developing strong literacy skills and effective communication; emphasising the importance of vocabulary acquisition and developing effective reading skills for life-long learning. We believe in developing an intrinsic love of learning and fascination with the world around us to enable each child to thrive.

Our teachers are subject specialists and work with colleagues at Emmanuel and

across The Archway Learning Trust to plan and deliver high-quality lessons. They are experts in their field and receive high-quality Professional Development, to ensure that their knowledge and skills remain fully up-to-date.

Transition

Ensuring that every Year 6 student arrives at Emmanuel well prepared and excited about the next phase of their educational journey is important to us. Our transition programme is highly regarded by parents and primary schools alike, offering students the opportunity to meet with Emmanuel staff in their primary setting and also come to Emmanuel for 'Getting to Know You' sessions, family meetings and transition days.

Once students start with us in September, we undertake activities, trips and team building days in order to forge the strong sense of community that is a hallmark of Emmanuel. We know that every child is unique and we endeavour to meet their transition needs, offering support to those with special educational needs or who have English as an additional language.

Service and Leadership

Part of living out our value of community means a commitment to every student taking part in social action. Each tutor group at Emmanuel organises and leads a fundraising activity of their choice in order to raise money for the house charities. This creates an exciting fundraising calendar each year, with activities ranging from charity football matches to chocolate hamper raffles.

Developing student leaders is also an integral part of life at Emmanuel and students can become buddies, house captains, HYPE team members as well as having the opportunity to lead Acts of Worship and engage in Sixth Form leadership programmes.



Enrichment

At Emmanuel we offer an outstanding enrichment programme with over 50 weekly clubs on offer at lunchtimes and after school.

All students are encouraged to attend at least two activities each week and there is something on offer to appeal to every student – we know how important enrichment activities are in the development of the whole child.

We also offer a Thursday afternoon enrichment programme to Year 7 students, as well

as study space for students in other year groups. Learning outside of the classroom is highly valued, and students are regularly offered local, national and international visits to support their learning and development.
