PEAK paragraphs are how we write our responses:

**Point-** Pick out a key idea in the poem to answer the question

**Evidence-** Back it up with a quote

**Analysis 1-** This is where you infer something from the quote in your words

**Analysis 2-** This is where you add detail

**Zoom-** zoom in on a particularly dramatic word and explore its layers of meaning to show you understand language choices

**K-** This is where you link your ideas back to the keyword in the question and link to the reader.

**Now you need to add a comparative sentence to link to your 2nd poem**

## Focus:

You will study a range of poems. They will be linked in a variety of ways such as themes and ideas.

Step 1: Work out the key ideas in the poem

Step 2: What language devices support this?

Step 3: How does the structure reflect these key ideas?

Step 4: What big messages do you think the poet is wanting to share with you?

Step 5: How does this compare to your second poem? In what ways are they related?
